The Devon Horse Show prides itself on playing host to top equitation talent year in and year out. Young riders from across the country must qualify for the opportunity to compete at Devon, so the classes are always a fight to the finish for that blue ribbon. The 2023 ASPCA Maclay was no different, boasting a total of 44, 44, and 43 entries respectively in each section. Olivia Sweetnam, Carlee McCutcheon, and Aeden Mooney stood above the rest with stellar rounds and pristine equitation form both in the flat and over fences.

Sweetnam on challenges on the course:

"I struggle getting a good rhythm to the first jump sometimes, and the first line was a little forward. The last line also had a bit of a blind turn so I just had to go for it."

McCutcheon on her performance:

"It was great. Chacco was amazing in the warm up. He had a long day yesterday so I knew he'd be a little tired and I'd have to work for it. But he's an incredible partner and I'm lucky to have him."

Mooney on Astro De Ravel:

"He's amazing. He's done the [equitation] for a few years and he's such a good partner. He does whatever you want him to do and has a fun personality."

Friday was for the ponies! A total of 30 horse-and-rider combinations embarked on the Wheeler Ring at the Devon Horse Show to showcase their skills to the panel of judges in the Small Pony Hunters division. In the hunter divisions, the young ponies are judged on several points including hunting pace, movement, style of jumping and manners. The riders are judged on their positioning, and their ability to communicate

and control their mounts. Although these horses and riders are young, they entered the ring with a calm confidence and no fear. The group of talented riders approached each jump in stride and held good form throughout the course. In the conformation class, horses are examined on any conformation defects, soundness, and way of walk and jog/trot. The top spot in the over fences conformation class was awarded to Kathryn Padilla and Celebration, while the top spot in the second over fences class was awarded to Ella Endzweig and Private Message.

R.W. "RONNIE" MUTCH EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP

The R.W. "Ronnie" Mutch Equitation Championship highlighted competition in the Dixon Oval Friday afternoon. Consistency is key if a rider hopes to take home the coveted award. With four classes that focus on both hunter and jumping seat equitation, riders must demonstrate their ability to tackle a variety of challenges and accumulate points to secure the trophy. For the second consecutive year, there was a tie between two riders at the end of the two-day competition. Avery Glynn piloted Acer K to several podium finishes

Thursday and Friday, while Carlee McCutcheon and Chacco Star always seemed to be at the top of the pack. Both riders showed off their dominant equitation form, communicating effectively with their mounts both over fences and in the flat phases. As young junior riders that are just embarking on their showjumping careers, both Glynn and McCutcheon are proving to be a force to be reckoned with and have very promising futures.

McCutcheon on Chacco Star:

"He loves to do anything thats hard - in and outs, S lines, and bending lines. He's really great about following my eye and is a seasoned horse."

Glynn on the R.W. "Ronnie" Mutch Equitation Championship Award:

"I put a lot of pressure on myself because I won co-champion of this award last year as well. I was really trying to go two-for-two and hold myself to the same standard."


