JIMMY TORANO WINS THE \$25,000 DEVON FALL CLASSIC

Day three of the Devon Fall Classic Horse Show welcomed jumper athletes back to the Dixon Oval for a full day of horse show competition. After the day classes concluded, the night featured 28 horse and rider combinations trying their hand at the course designed by Peter Grant (CAN) for the \$25,000 Devon Fall Classic sponsored by Jaguar Land Rover Main Line.

This class was set to a Table II, 2(a) format. For this format all horse and rider combinations compete in the first round of this class. If they go clear in the first round, they return back to the arena after all competitors have completed their rounds and ride a shortened course. The goal is to not only go fast in each round, but also clear.

Ten of the 28 entries went clear in front of packed stands. The eager crowd cheered on each rider as they put on a competition like no other.

After an exhilarating jump off round there were only two horse and rider combinations who were able to go clear. With a time of 40.645 it was Jimmy Torano and Kochio Z who left the crowd on the edge of their seats and took home the coveted Devon blue ribbon.

Having held the lead for a total of eight trips, Eleanor Kunsman and Jermaine HX were able to secure second with a time of 41.684 seconds.

To finish off the top three was Arielle Aharoni and Dutch Times with a time of 38.237 seconds and four faults.

LEADLINE

Leadline is a long standing tradition at the Devon Horse Show and Country Fair and the Devon Fall Classic Horse Show. Leadline is a class for young children, generally under the age of seven. The horse and rider are led by a handler of their choosing while the child is judged on their equitation, seat, leg and hand position as they walk and trot around the ring.

The young riders entered the ring on their respective mounts ready to impress the judges and take home a blue ribbon. After the handlers led the horses and riders around the ring, the judges lined them up to do their final judging. At the conclusion of the class, there was a five way tie for first in which Logan Gallagher, Nora Yenner, Ari McCloskey Blanche, Penelope Dever and Kayla Harris all earned themselves a coveted Devon blue ribbon.

\$7,500 SJHF HIGH JUNIOR/AMATEUR JUMPER


As fans filled the seats at the historic Devon Horse Show grounds, Junior/Amateur jumper riders prepared to put on a show in the famed Dixon Oval.
